
Departmental Activities

STUDENTS' SEMINAR







DETAILS: The Department of History organized a "Students' Seminar" for Semester-II students on 28th April 2023 at Room No. 25. The seminar focused on "Non-Violence and Its Relevance in the Contemporary World." Students were divided into three groups representing Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose, Mahatma Gandhi, and Sarojini Naidu, who played important roles in India's freedom movement. The group on Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose talked about his belief in armed struggle and his leadership in the Indian National Army, highlighting his views on achieving independence through military action. The group on Mahatma Gandhi discussed his principles of Ahimsa and Satyagraha, showing how peaceful resistance can bring change. The group on Sarojini Naidu explained her role as a poet, freedom fighter, and advocate for women's rights and civil liberties. It also helped them understand historical events, participate in debates and think critically. By learning about these leaders' ideas and contributions, students developed a better understanding of history and its importance today while improving their research and public speaking skills.

DEPARTMENTAL BOOK DISPLAY

Dr. Mahadev Paul, the Teacher-In-Charge of the college, inaugurated the event. Students, college staff, guests and students from various schools and colleges attended the book display, where they explored a diverse collection of historical books and research materials. The event-encouraged students to develop reading habits, engage in research and appreciate the importance of historical literature. It also included discussions on different career opportunities for History students, such as teaching, research, archaeology, civil services, museum work and heritage management. School students showed great enthusiasm for the collection, and many expressed interest in studying History in the future.

STUDENTS' SEMINAR





As part of the academic activities of the Department of History, the department organised a Students' Seminar on 22nd November 2024 from 12.30 p.m. to 02.30 p.m. at Room No. 25. Shri Sanjib Thapa, the Head of the Department of History inaugurated the event. The seminar, held for Semester-I History Major students, focused on "Harappan Civilization vs. Vedic Period" and discovered the differences in society, economy, politics, religion and culture between these two historical periods. Students discussed the urban planning, trade, script and advanced drainage system of the Harappan Civilization and compared it with the agrarian lifestyle, Vedic texts, evolving political structures and religious practices of the Vedic Period. They also examined the decline of the Harappan Civilization and the rise of Vedic society, highlighting the shift from an urban to a rural-based civilization. This seminar helped students gain a better understanding of early Indian history, improve their research and analytical skills, enhance their public speaking abilities and develop critical thinking by comparing these two important historical periods.

EDUCATIONAL TOUR















The Department of History organised a three-day Educational Tour to Murshidabad from 3rd to 5th December 2024. A team of 32 participants traveled 237 km from Sovarani Memorial College to explore the historical significance of Murshidabad and its surrounding areas. The department chose this destination because sites like Hazarduari and other historical landmarks play a vital role in the history of Bengal and India. During the tour, students visited important historical sites, observed Mughal and British-era architecture and learned about the region's administrative and cultural heritage. This firsthand experience helped them understand historical events better and connect classroom knowledge with real-world landmarks. The trip also improved their observational and analytical skills, sparked curiosity, encouraged historical research and strengthened their appreciation for heritage conservation.
