Welcome to Sovarani Memorial College

Sovarani Memorial College, an institute of higher studies, was founded by Late Satyanarayan Khan in 1971 in memory of his beloved better-half Sovarani Devi. Its official journey started on 1st December, 1971. Satyanarayan Khan was a man of dedication, diverse social works and had love for education. He had a keen desire for dissemination of higher education among the people of Jagatballavpur, a village in the district of Howrah. This is a co-educational day college, now imparting teaching in 11 Honours subjects and 16 General course subjects of 3 streams (Arts, Science & Commerce). We take pride in having a highly functional NCC-unit being smoothly run under the guidance of a CTO, an NSS-unit, a Gymnasium, a Library equipped with a huge number of books, modern facilities, a yoga centre, a computer centre and good laboratories.



At present, all admission procedures are done online.

There has been a change in the Admission-Examination system with effect from the academic session: 2022-23. Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF) has been introduced in the College via University of Calcutta, based on National Education Policy (NEP) - 2020. In this new system, students will have much more flexibility in respect of choice/selection of subjects vis-à-vis the discipline of their study. It is expected of the students to attend the college on a regular basis which is mandatory in the new system. The College authority will try to provide various facilities to the students as much as possible. Students are also expected to be associated with the NCC, the NSS and the Gymnasium. In the end, it is our collective responsibility to ensure all-round development of our institution. With the wholehearted cooperation of the teachers, students, teaching staffs, the locals and the well wishers, we can actualise the dream of Late Satyanarayan Khan.

INCEPTION:

Sovarani Memorial College came into existence on 1st December, 1971 at the picturesque village of Goalpota under Jagatballavpur Block in Howrah district. The college campus is only 35 km away from Kolkata and spreaded over more than 3 acres of land, standing beautifully on the banks of the river 'Kana Damodar'.

ACTUALISATION OF A DREAM:

This college which has rural and natural surroundings is actually the brainchild of a rural housewife, Late Mrs. Sovarani Devi, wife of great Late Mr. Satyanarayan Khan, the founder of the college. Though she had no opportunity to enter into the arena of higher learning, she had energised her courage for a lofty dream of establishing a centre of higher education in this backward zone of Bengal and enlightening its girls and boys so that one day they would be able to compete with the advanced sections of the country. She succeeded in instilling this dream into the mind of her husband, who had a great heart for the upliftment of his fellow people reeling under poverty and illiteracy. The visionary couple then inspired people of this zone for their active co-operation and generous contributions for the establishment of what is now known as the Sovarani Memorial College. This College has already become a temple of higher learning in rural Bengal catering to the needs of this zone and beyond, in the fields of education and social welfare.

FORMATIVE PERIOD:

In the beginning, the College had no building of its own. The classes were held in one of the historic residential buildings of Mr. Satyanarayan Khan at Goalpota village from the session 1971-72. At the initial stage, as a degree College affiliated to the University of Calcutta, it offered General Courses for Bengali, English, History, Philosophy and Political Science at the undergraduate level and Commerce at the Pre-University level.

FIRST GOVERNING BODY:

Mr. Satyanarayan Khan was the first President of the College Organizing Committee. Mr. Nandalal Ghosh, Bar-at-Law, was the first President of the Governing Body and Mr. Dilip Kumar Khan, son of Satyanarayan Khan, was the first Secretary of the College.

FIRST PRINCIPAL:

Dr. Anadi Kumar Mahapatra, Head of the Department of Political Science, was the first Teacher-in-Charge of the College from 01.12.1971 to 19.05.1973. Mr. Sudhir Kumar Roy took over from him on 20.05.1973 as the first Principal of the College.

Teachers' Council

A Teachers' Council, constituted as per the Statute of the University of Calcutta, comprises all whole time permanent teachers of the College. The Council helps the College administration in carrying out various academic and administrative functions of the College.

Non-Teaching Council

The Non-teaching Staff of the College play a very significant role in the smooth functioning of the College administration. The Non-Teaching Council is a democratic body comprising members of the non-teaching staff. This body assists the College administration through their active participation and representation.

Administrative Hierarchy

The TIC of the College runs the College administration assisted by the Teachers' Council and the Non-Teaching Council. The Governing Body is the highest authority in the college. There are Anti-ragging & Grievance Redressal Cells in the College where students can express their grievances in written form.

Affiliation

The College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta and offers four and three year degree courses in Arts, Commerce and Science streams (both Major and Minor).

ACHIEVEMENTS:

National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC), the authority to assess the performances of the higher educational institutes of the country has accredited our college with CGPA of 2.16 on seven point scale at B Grade, which is valid up to May 10, 2030. In the post NAAC period, we have applied for RUSA 2.0 (Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan). We are being selected among 622 colleges out of about 5800 colleges in our country successfully obtaining the grant for building infrastructure which will solve our acute space problem in future. Specially, we need more class rooms and increased laboratory space in future to excel in catering quality education.

The objective is to upgrade the college to an institution catering to the needs of the students, particularly belonging to the backward classes of society, in spite of its limitations like the rural background, the acute shortage of permanent staff (both teaching and non-teaching), infrastructural deficiencies etc.

Admission in 4-years degree program and 3-years degree program for the Session: 2026-2027 under CCF, 2022:

Applications for admission to the first Semester classes in B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. are being invited from eligible candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary(10+2)/Equivalent Examination not before 2020 . Application form will be available (www.smc.edu.in) from 1st July, 2023 to 15th July, 2023 (11.59 PM) online.

The following regulations shall come into force with effect from the academic session 2023-2024.

1. THE REGULATIONS FOR SEMESTER WISE 4 YEAR B.A./B.Sc. DEGREE PROGRAMME under CCF, 2022 (CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK). UNIVERSITY OF CALCUTTA.

Admission

Regulations:

(a) A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the B.A./B.Sc. (Single-Major) Course of Studies provided the candidate has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 and fulfills the conditions as laid down in clause 5, 10, 11 and 12. **However, no student shall be allowed to take admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.**

(Explanation: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating three years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination).

(b) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not require to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.

Eligibility:

For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the B.A./B.Sc./ (Single-Major) Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a student. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject

“Environmental Science” is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

(a) A student taking up Major Course in a subject must have obtained:

i. A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

Or

ii. 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

Or

iii. 50% marks in the aggregate when the student has not studied the subject in his/her

previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied.

(b) Students belonging to Reserved Categories taking up Major Course of Study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.

(c) Seat reservation for admission in the first year class of four-year (eight semesters) degree courses of studies shall be guided by the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act, 2013 and the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014 and Memorandum No. 339-Edn (CS)/OM-74L/2023, dt. 26.05.2023.

**2. THE REGULATIONS FOR SEMESTER WISE 3 YEAR
B.A./B.Sc.(Multidisciplinary) DEGREE PROGRAMME under CCF
(CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK). UNIVERSITY OF
CALCUTTA.**

Admission Regulations:

(a) A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the B.A./B.Sc. (Multidisciplinary) Course of Studies provided the student has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 and fulfills the conditions as laid down in clause 5, 10, 11 and 12.

Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Vocational examination conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the B.A. (Multidisciplinary) 1st year Course of Studies taking the subjects under Humanities Discipline only. **However, no student shall be allowed admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.**

(Explanation: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating three years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination).

(b) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not be required to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.

Eligibility:

For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the B.A./B.Sc. (Multidisciplinary) Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a student. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject “Environmental Science” is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

Seat reservation for admission in the first year class of three-year (six semesters) degree courses of studies shall be guided by the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act, 2013 and the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014 and Memorandum No. 339-Edn (CS)/OM-74L/2023, dt. 26.05.2023.

Applicability of the Regulations:

- a) These regulations shall be applicable to the students taking admission to the B.A./B.Sc. Course from the academic session 2023-2024.
- b) Students who have already successfully completed any U.G. degree earlier are not eligible to take admission into the above course.

3. These Regulations shall be called THE REGULATIONS FOR SEMESTER WISE **Four-Year B.Com. Honours or Honours with Research / Three-Year B.Com Degree Programme** under CCF (CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK), UNIVERSITY OF CALCUTTA.

Admission Regulations:

(a) A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the Four-Year B.Com. Honours or Honours with Research / Three-Year B.Com Degree Course of Studies provided he/she has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 and fulfills the conditions as laid down in clause 5, 10, 11 and 12.

Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Vocational Examination in Business and Commerce conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the first year of the three-year B.Com course of studies under this University. **However, no candidate shall be allowed to take admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.**

(Explanation: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating three years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination).

(b) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not require to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.

Eligibility:

For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the Four-Year B.Com. Honours or Honours with Research / Three-Year B.Com Degree Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a candidate. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

A student taking up Four-Year B.Com. Honours or Honours with Research Course of study in a subject must have obtained:

(a) i) A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

Or

ii) 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

(b) However, students belonging to the scheduled caste or scheduled tribe community taking up 4-year honours course of study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.

(c) Related subjects: Accountancy, Business Economics including Business Mathematics, Business Organization, Mathematics, Business Mathematics, Economics, Statistics, Business Studies, Office & Secretarial practice, Financial Accounting, Elements of Cost Accountancy and Auditing, Book keeping, Commerce, Cost Accountancy and Principles of Management, Commercial Law and Preliminaries of Auditing, Costing & Taxation.

(d) A student taking up three-year B.Com course of study must fulfill eligibility conditions stated in clause no. 4

(e) Seat reservation for admission in the first year class of four-year Honours (eight semesters)/ Three-year (six semesters) B.Com. courses of studies shall be guided by the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions Reservation in Admission, Act, 2013 and the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014 and Memorandum No. 339-Edn (CS)/OM-74L/2023, dt.26.05.2023

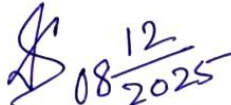

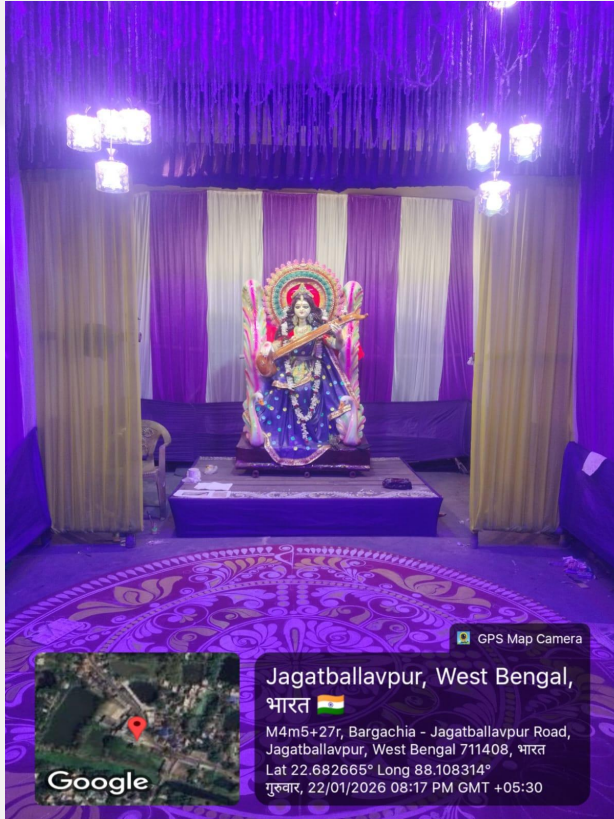
